- **Perdana Putra** – houses the main administrative offices of the Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Minister, Ministers and Deputy Ministers in the Prime Minister’s Department, Chief Secretary to the Government as well as the Special Units. It features striking green domes and its main block is decorated with stone carvings and wrought iron with motifs of the bunga raya or hibiscus, the national flower. A combination of Islamic and Mogul architecture, this majestic structure overlooks the picturesque Lake Putrajaya.
- **Putrajaya International Convention Center (photo stop)** – the design idea of this unique and impressive building is based on the shape of the eye of 'pending perak' (a silver Malay royal belt buckle). From the front view, the building's eaves or wings are lifted at the sides, creating broad overhanging over the raking wall.
- **Putra Mosque** – the stately Putra Mosque is one of Putrajaya’s most famous landmarks and three quarter of the beautiful mosque floats on the Putrajaya Lake. It has a unique pink dome which is constructed from rose-tinted granite and comprises of a prayer hall, the sahn or courtyard, learning facilities and function rooms. The mosque accommodates 15,000 worshippers and boasts a 116-metre, five-tiered minaret, the tallest in the region.
- **Alamanda Mall** – it's a shopper's destination providing shopping, fun & exciting entertainment and mouth-watering range of treats. With Carrefour and Parkson Grand as anchor tenants and along with 150 other tenants, take pleasure in strolling around and enjoy the best deals.
